## SUMMARY OF INFORMATION:

The Forsyth County Community and Economic Development Department proposes to apply for a Community Development Block Grant in the amount of $\$ 1,800,000$ from the North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality to construct a drinking water distribution system that will extend a water line approximately 2.5 miles along Highway 65 (Rural Hall-Germanton Road) east of the Town of Rural Hall. This area is dependent on wells that have periodically gone dry or only provide minimal amounts of water.

## RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION TO NORTH CAROLINA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY FOR A COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF $\$ 1,800,000$ (COMMUNITY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT)

WHEREAS Title 1 of the Federal Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, has established the U.S. Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program and has authorized the making of grants to aid eligible units of government in funding the cost of construction, replacement, or rehabilitation of water and wastewater infrastructure;

WHEREAS the North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality, Division of Water Infrastructure, was delegated the authority by the state legislature to administer the water and wastewater infrastructure portion of the State grant monies received form the U.S. HUD CDBG Program by Session Law 2013-360, Section 15.15(a) as amended by Section 5.3 of Session Law 2013-363;

WHEREAS Forsyth County has need for and intends to construct a drinking water distribution system project described as the Highway 65 Waterline Extension Project that will extend an eight-inch waterline for approximately 2.5 miles along Highway 65 from approximately 375 ' east of College Street eastward to Abshire Road; and

WHEREAS Forsyth County intends to request State grant assistance for the project;
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Forsyth County Board of Commissioners that the City/County Utility Commission will adopt and place into effect, on or before completion of the project, a schedule of fees and charges and other available funds which will provide adequate funds for proper and efficient operation, maintenance, and administration of the system and that the City/County Utility Commission will provide for efficient operation and maintenance of the project on completion of construction thereof;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Forsyth County Board of Commissioners that J. Dudley Watts, Jr., the Authorized Official, and successors so titled, is hereby authorized to execute and file an application, on behalf of Forsyth County, with the State of North Carolina for a grant to aid in the construction of the project described above;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Forsyth County Board of Commissioners that J. Dudley Watts, Jr., the Authorized Official, and successors so titled, is hereby authorized and directed to furnish such information as the appropriate State agency may request in connection with such application or the project; to make the assurances as contained above; and to execute such other documents as may be required in connection with the application; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Forsyth County has substantially complied or will substantially comply with all Federal, State, and local laws, rules, regulations, and ordinances applicable to the project and to Federal and State grants and loans pertaining thereto.

# NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING RELATIVE TO APPLICATION <br> BY FORSYTH COUNTY, NC, FOR FUNDING UNDER THE HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT ACT OF 1974, AS AMENDED 

Notice is hereby given that Forsyth County will conduct a public hearing on September 12, 2019, at 2:00 p.m., at the Forsyth County Government Center located at 201 N, Chestnut Street Winston-Salem, NC, 27101, relative to the intention of the County to apply for Fiscal year 2020 CDBG funding under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act.

Forsyth County intends to submit an application for a grant of an estimated $\mathbf{\$ 1 , 8 0 0 , 0 0 0}$ in CDBG Infrastructure funds to finance the extension of an 8 " public water line along Highway 65 (Rural HallGermanton Rd) extending east from the intersection of Highway 65 (Rural Hall-Germanton Road) approximately 2.5 miles and will terminate at Abshire Road. This area is located adjacent to the town limits of Rural Hall.
The following is a tentative list of proposed activities and an estimated budget. The final application will be reviewed at the public hearing.

The proposed project will provide benefits to very low and moderate income households residing adjacent to the above describe area. At least $51 \%$ of the total households residing in the target area are considered low and moderate income as surveyed by County staff. No individuals will be displaced nor will any require temporary relocation assistance as a result of the proposed project.
Citizens will be given the opportunity to provide oral and written comment on the County's past and proposed use of CDBG funds at the public hearing. All interested citizens are encouraged to attend.
