RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF NORTH CAROLINA TO ENACT LEGISLATION TO ESTABLISH IN FORSYTH COUNTY AN OPEN SEASON FOR TAKING COYOTES AND FOXES USING WEAPONS AND A TRAPPING SEASON FOR TRAPPING COYOTES AND FOXES

WHEREAS, Forsyth County is experiencing an increase in the population of coyotes and foxes, which exposes the County's native wildlife, domestic animals, and residents to increased risk of attacks by these animals and the diseases which they carry.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Forsyth County Board of Commissioners hereby requests the General Assembly of North Carolina to enact legislation to establish in Forsyth County an open season for taking coyotes and foxes using weapons and a trapping season for trapping coyotes and foxes.

GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF NORTH CAROLINA SESSION 2018

SESSION LAW 2018-HOUSE or SENATE BILL

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH IN FORSYTH COUNTY AN OPEN SEASON FOR TAKING COYOTES AND FOXES WITH WEAPONS AND A TRAPPING SEASON FOR TRAPPING COYOTES AND FOXES

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the following are established:

- (a) An open season for taking coyotes and foxes with weapons; and
- (b) A trapping season for coyotes and foxes, during the trapping season set by the North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission each year. For foxes that are trapped, there are no tagging requirements prior to or after sale of the pelt or carcass.
- SECTION 2. No bag limit applies to coyotes and foxes taken under this act.
- **SECTION 3.** This act applies only to FORSYTH County.
- **SECTION 4.** This act becomes effective October 1, 2018.
