WHEREAS the CPD solicitation is open to all public governmental agencies, for-profit and nonprofit organizations, institutions of higher education, community groups, and faith-based organizations; and

WHEREAS if awarded \$500,000 in 2019 CPD program funds, the Sheriff's Office will advance community policing in the County, increase awareness of active community policing strategies, improve skills and abilities of law enforcement and community partners, and increase the number of relevant stakeholders using proven community policing practices;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Forsyth County Board of Commissioners hereby authorizes the Chairman or County Manager and the Clerk to the Board to execute the necessary documents, on behalf of Forsyth County, to apply for and accept grant funds from the U.S. Department of Justice, Office Of Community Oriented Policing Services, for the 2019 Community Policing Development Program, of \$500,000, to help the Forsyth County Sheriff's Office develop the capacity of law enforcement to build bridges and relationships between law enforcement and the community through the hiring of two (2) civilian/nonsworn positions for the Community Outreach section, subject to a pre-audit certificate thereon by the County Chief Financial Officer, where applicable, and approval as to form and legality by the County Attorney; and further subject to compliance with the applicable bidding laws.
