The Ordinance states that such actions are to be reported to the Board at its next Board meeting and recorded in the minutes of that meeting. The appropriation transfers reports consist of:

- 2. Transfers out of Non-Departmental Contingency; and/or
- 3. Transfers for Departmental Special Gifts received.

During October 2015, one transfer occurred within the first category - Transfers between Departments; one transfer occurred within the second category - Transfers out of Non-Departmental Contingency; and one transfer occurred within the third category - Department Special Gifts Transfer.

Appropriation Transfer(s)

 A transfer was made between Aging Services and the Department of Social Services as the FY2016 ROAP grant allocated \$82,575 for job-related transportation services for workforce development. The majority of the ROAP grant funds were budgeted in Aging Services and with the actual allocation of ROAP grant funds designated for workforce development, the transfer from Aging Services was necessary.
