## THE BEGINNING:

Nathan Barrick, the Forsyth County 4-H Council President, wanted to create a citizenship project for 4-H and thought of the homeless. He learned about a project called H2O and decided to utilize their resources to jumpstart the effort.

Leslie and Lauren Reavely (ages fourteen and eleven) launched **HOPE 2 OTHERS**, in summer 2006 to meet the needs of homeless people in their city and provide them with hope and a simple nonperishable meal.

**H2O** bags cost three dollars each, to cover the cost of the contents, and are intended for drivers to have in their cars so that when they meet a homeless person, instead of giving them money, they have a constructive solution to meet some of that person's needs.



## WHAT'S IN THE BAG

**H2O** bags contain the following items:

- Water bottle
- Granola bar
- Tuna and crackers
- Crackers w/ Peanut Butter
- Mints
- Fruit leather
- Kleenex
- Hand wipes
- Mens Black Crew Socks

## WHAT YOU CAN DO:

- Besides handing out bags, donations (cash or check) can be made to **Forsyth County 4-H** for supplies. Or, you can donate some of the supplies needed for the **H2O** bags. You can also ask your local church, synagogue (or place of worship), your school, or community group about purchasing bags for your members to hand-out.
